Province Director's Message

Dear Council Sisters of the Superior Diocesan
Council of Catholic Women,

Fall greetings to all of you. Hopefully, many of you were able to enjoy the beautiful fall colors and landscapes. God creates beautiful masterpieces every day!

Now is the time for many ladies 'groups to gather and plan their activities for the year. One of the plans should include the NCCW Resolution(s) voted upon at the NCCW Convention. These Resolutions are timely and address issues that are important to Catholic women in the parishes, and deaneries in the Diocese of Superior.

The following is the NCCW Resolution adopted on August 25, 2023, at the Convention Business Meeting of the National Council of Catholic Women.

<u>Title:</u> Belief in the Real Presence <u>Purpose:</u> To foster increased understanding of the Church's teaching on Jesus' Real Presence in the Eucharist:

Whereas, the Catechism of the Catholic Church states, "The Eucharist is the 'source and summit of the Christian life," (CCC1324)

Whereas, the Bishops of the United States are calling for a three-year Eucharistic Revival, *My Flesh for the Life of the World,* at all levels of the Church in our country, and

Whereas, a personal encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist brings healing, grace, and strength for us as missionary disciples,

Resolved, that members reflect on Church teaching by utilizing the NCCW Spirituality Commission study guide "Woman of the Eucharist" and promote this study which corresponds to the 6th chapter of the Encyclical letter *On the Eucharist in Its Relationship to the Church* and sponsor this study at the parish level.

Resolved, that NCCW affiliates would supplement this study by encouraging member-led participation in frequent and regular Eucharistic Adoration that may include reciting the Rosary, Chaplet, or other devotions.

Resolved, that each NCCW Province be encouraged to and make every effort to send a representative to the Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis, July 2024.

Ideas for including this Resolution in your Council's activities:

- Support your Priest and assist with your parish's initiative on helping others understand the Church's teachings on Jesus' Real Presence in the Eucharist.
- Read and study Bishop Power's Pastoral Letter on Evangelization.
- Present and promote the NCCW Spirituality Study Guide to your ladies' group.
- Encourage frequent and regular Eucharist Adoration, praying the Rosary, Chaplet, or other devotions.
- Check the website for the Diocese of Superior there are many resources listed on the Eucharistic Revival.

By the time many of you receive this newsletter it will be closer to Thanksgiving. May you take time to reflect on the many good things God has brought into your lives. May you be surrounded with God's love and healing graces. May this season be a time to share our love and share our stories of the good news of our Councils and remember the many friendships we have made along the way.

I am thankful for the women in the Diocese of Superior and the Province of Milwaukee for their many wonderful acts of service and kindness done for others in their homes, schools, parishes, and communities!
